






Are missing skill sets the problem?




Demand for (mid-career) ddj-training @MAZ

We are Gatekeepers – until now



- I. Journalist (J) thinks about what the audience (A) needs to know (Gatekeeper)?
- 2. Journalist searches for sources: Experts (E), they provide (processed) Information (I)
- 3. Present findings according to the media the journalists work for.

The recipe for «good» journalism — until now

- I. what: what we journalist think is relevant.
- 2. **how** (journalistic form /channel): what we journalist think **makes sense** / the **channel we have**.

3. **when**: when we have our **deadline**.

We are Sense-Makers from now on



- Journalist (J) thinks about what the audience (A) needs to understand (Sense-Maker) Sources: Information (I), (in cooperation with experts (E)) Processing information (in cooperation with experts) Interpreting information (in cooperation with experts) Summarizing findings: form follows function (not internal functions!)
